

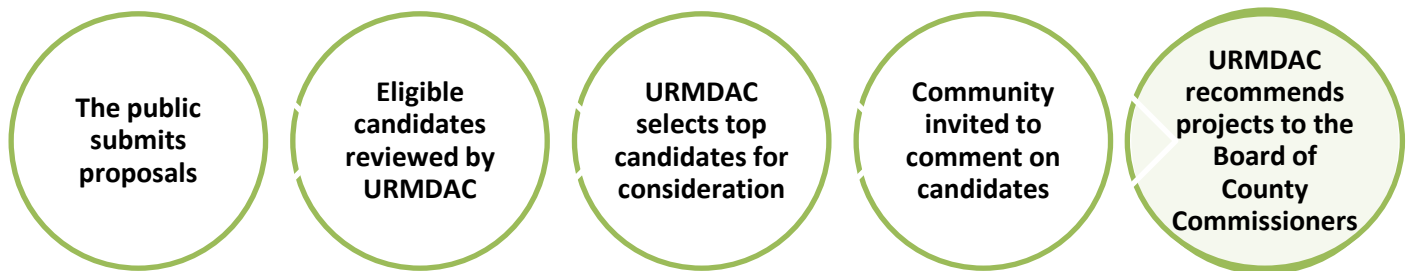
OVERVIEW: URMD PEDESTRIAN AND BIKING IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

The **Urban Road Maintenance District (URMD)** funds small-scale pedestrian and biking improvement projects, which include sidewalks, pathways, bike lanes and paved shoulders. Since 2011, 49 URMD Pedestrian and Biking Improvement Projects totaling over \$21 million have been funded. Currently, over 100 URMD candidates have been identified for consideration in the future.

The fundamental criteria:

1. **Safety:** They are intended to improve a specific pedestrian or biking safety concern.
2. **Location:** They must be located within URMD.
3. **Small scale:** Typical projects cost less than \$500,000, though larger projects may be considered.

URMD project selection process:



Propose a candidate for URMD funding:

To propose a candidate, submit an online form at bit.ly/SRIrequest. Eligible candidates must address a safety or connectivity issue on an URMD-eligible County road.
