

URMD

The Urban Road Maintenance District (URMD) is a county service district formed to fund the maintenance of neighborhood streets in Washington County that are outside of cities.

When URMD was formed in 1987, urban neighborhood streets had deteriorated due to a lack of funding for preventive maintenance. URMD's primary mission is to fund maintenance

of urban neighborhood streets. URMD does not fund maintenance on arterials or collectors. URMD funds pedestrian and biking improvement projects, however, on all road classes within the URMD boundaries.
